



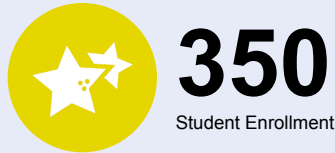

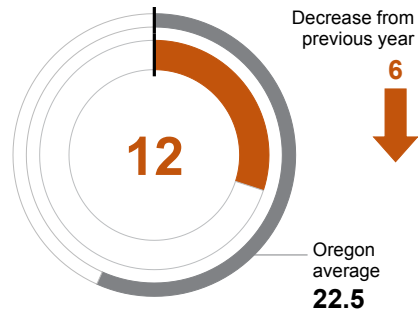

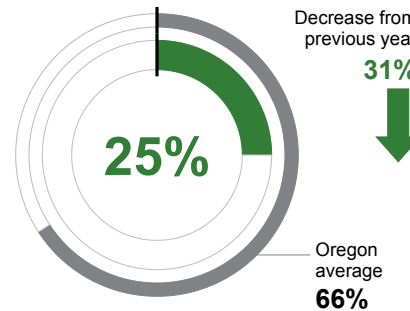
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

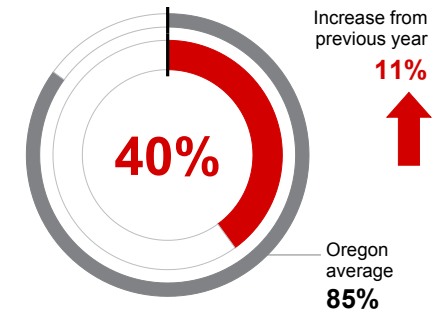

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

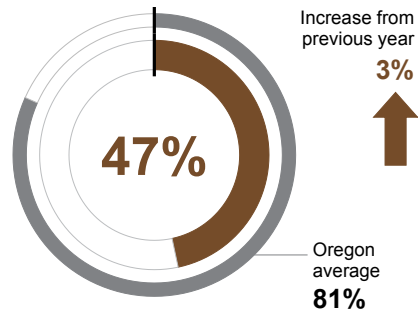
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

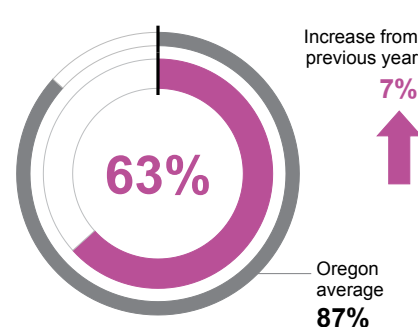
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.



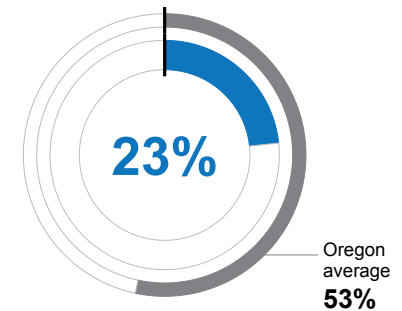
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Improving attendance rates for students is an important goal as those who attend regularly have improved success. Many of our students lack credits, so staff strives to provide a strong credit recovery program to assist students to attain their completion goals. We place students at a local community college to explore career paths and earn credits toward graduation. Our students who are over 18 need additional support to complete their diploma, so improving the 5 year completer rate is another area of focus for our staff.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Falcon Heights is committed to creating a school environment in which every student feels safe and experiences a sense of belonging. We conduct monthly safety meetings, trainings, and evacuation drills to ensure the safety of both students and staff. About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Falcon Heights offers advanced coursework through dual credit partnerships with Klamath Community College and AP/Honors online curriculum. Our students also have access to college level coursework through our career pathways program at Klamath Community College.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

CTE stands for Career and Technical Education. These are the classes that focus on specific job skills that make your student more marketable in today's job market. CTE opportunities at Falcon Heights include career planning, business classes, culinary arts, and courses in the automotive field. Not only do our CTE programs begin the process of preparing students for real world jobs, they may also connect directly to certificates and programs at Klamath Community College.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
